Coins on Military Tombstones. COL Dave Taylor a Vietnam veteran explains the tradition and reason behind it.

A coin left on a headstone lets the deceased Soldier's family know that somebody stopped to pay respects. If you leave a penny, it means you visited. A nickel means that you and the deceased Sailor trained at boot camp together. If you served with the deceased Marine, you leave a dime. A quarter is very significant because it means that you were there when the Airman was killed.

Taylor says the tradition became popular during the Vietnam War. It is believed it was a way to show respect without getting into an uncomfortable political discussion about a war the was very controversial.

So this Memorial Day take a coin or two when you visit an American Military
Hero's grave site and say a prayer of thanks for the brave men and women who answered the call. God Bless America!
