We strongly recommend that you make use of the services provided by County Veterans Service Officers. Our expertise can help you avoid the pitfalls and delays that missing paperwork or improperly filled out claim forms can cause.

#### THE THIRTEEN FOLDS OF THE AMERICAN FLAG

Most Americans have at some point in their lives have witness the traditional folding of old glory. This experience may have taken place at a veteran's gathering, but most likely at a veteran's burial ceremony. What might not be known to many Americans is that the flag has thirteen folds, and each fold has a principle associated with each one. Below you can read and learn what each fold represents. They speak volumes on the values that make this nation great.

- The First Fold symbolizes life.
- The Second Fold represents a belief in eternal life.
- The Third Fold is made in honor and
   Tribute of the veteran departing our ranks, and who
   gave a portion of his or her life for the defense of our country to attain peace.
- The Fourth Fold Exemplifies our weaker nature as citizens trusting in God; it is to Him we turn for His divine guidance.
- The Fifth Fold is an acknowledgement to our country.
- The Sixth Fold symbolizes where our hearts lie. It is in our heart that we pledge of allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.
- The Seventh Fold pays tribute to our armed forces, for it is through the armed forces that we protect our country and our flag against all enemies.
- The Eighth Fold is a tribute to the one who entered the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see light of day and to honor our mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.
- The Ninth Fold An honor to womanhood, for it has been through their faith, love, loyalty, and devotion that the character of men and women who have made this country great have been molded.

- The Tenth Fold is a tribute to fathers, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since he or she was first-born,
- The Eleventh Fold is in the eyes of Hebrew citizens represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies, in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.
- The Twelve-Fold in the eyes of Christian citizens, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes God the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost.
- The Thirteen-Fold when the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost, reminding us of our national motto, "In God We Trust."

After reading the thirteen principles I hope that it leaves you with a sense of pride, hope and a better understanding of all that our flag represents. They are a good reminder why we as a nation need to remember the importance of living a life that appreciates, respects, and includes all Americans in our daily lives.

If you visit the Webster Rural cemetery you will find these principles located on a pedestal sign at the base of the flagpole. The pedestal sign was an Eagle project by a young man from Webster. A perfect home for these principles to be placed.


#### PEARL HARBOR CEREMONY

WORLD WAR I Memorial, Washington DC As we approach Veterans Day on November 11, I was surprised to learn that the WWI Memorial was not dedicated until April 16, 2021 and it is still a work in progress with final completion slated for 2024. That is 105 years since the armistice was signed on November 11, 1918 at 11:00. Hence the 11th month, 11th day, 11th hour.

The Memorial will provide the opportunity to give long overdue recognition to 4.7 million Americans who served. These Men and Women served with the same valor and courage as the Veterans of later wars. The Nation's WWI sacrifice was great 204,000 Americans were wounded and 116,516 perished. "Least We Forget"

# NEW POLICY TO HELP SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN-OWNED BUSINESS

An Executive Order was signed on October 18th, 2023, to ensure that service-disabled veteran-owned businesses have equal opportunity to receive and participate in County contracts. The policy has a number of objectives, including expanding opportunities for service-disabled veteran-owned businesses, promoting and encouraging the continuing economic development of service-disabled veteran-owned businesses, and encouraging and supporting eligible businesses to play a greater role in the economy of the county by increasing participation in Monroe County's contracting opportunities. The policy also removes barriers to the participation of SDVOBs in Monroe County contracts by adding a 6% goal for spend with New York State Certified SDVOBs on all eligible contracts.
